Building on the momentum of our milestone 25th anniversary, the 26th Festival was our most successful yet. This is a testament to our incredible artists, vendors, sponsors, volunteers, partners, entertainers, and the thousands of enthusiastic visitors who brought the weekend to life.

With beautiful weather, expanded marketing efforts, and a record-breaking roster of 181 artists, the Festival saw a strong increase in weekend sales, surpassing our previous all-time high. The volume of attendees proved that the Festival is a primary draw for our region, with an estimated 44,000–46,000 attendees over the weekend.

The Festival awarded over \$10,000 in prize money to juried Fine artists and Folk & Heritage artists. Many artists and food vendors reported one of their most successful years, with one participating artist sharing, "The organization and the way this Festival is run is unparalleled. The attendance and caliber of attendees, as well as the diversity of artistry are amazing. The entertainment & marching band on Sunday are great!"

Festival favorites like the Chalk Art Oasis, Children's Park, and Community Corner continue to draw crowds with interactive experiences for all ages. Visitors also enjoyed live performances by local entertainers and talented Leon County School students, who generously donated their time and talents throughout the weekend.

On Sunday, the celebration continued with a musical procession by the Rickards High School Marching Raider Band. These performers brought a massive surge of energy and the band leader has agreed to make this an annual performance.

Presented by Mad Dog Construction, the Chain of Parks Art Festival directly supports LeMoyne's year-round exhibitions and educational programs—and continues to grow in both scope and impact.

Programming highlights included Opening Nights Presenting Artist guest speaker Noah Verrier; "Garden Guardians," an upcycled sculpture exhibition and silent auction; and a new Downtown Restaurant Week initiative, in collaboration with the Downtown Improvement Authority (DIA) to bridge the Festival with the business district.

A standout addition on Saturday was the inaugural Puppet Procession, an imaginative parade featuring large-scale puppets crafted from upcycled materials by Linda Hall and Doug Schrock. They were accompanied by a group of professional musicians and volunteer artists. The vibrant procession earned glowing feedback, with many attendees highlighting it as one of the most memorable Festival experiences.

LeMoyne Arts Expands Outdoor Sculpture Gardens with Major Installations by T.D. Giddings and Mark Dickson

LeMoyne Arts is proud to announce the installation of two major outdoor sculptures by acclaimed Tallahassee artists T.D. Giddings and Mark Dickson, further expanding LeMoyne's evolving outdoor sculpture gardens and permanent collection.

Installed on the grounds of LeMoyne's historic campus, the sculptures represent a significant investment in accessible, public art, and reflect LeMoyne's ongoing commitment to engaging visitors, neighbors, and the broader community with the region's artistic legacy.

Eroded Shell Form, by T.D. Giddings, celebrates forms that have been weathered, carved, and transformed over time. Fabricated in steel, the sculpture features richly textured surfaces, undulating movement, and an exaggerated scale that combines strength with fluidity. Visitors are invited to walk through and around the sculpture, discovering its shifting forms and perspectives from every angle.

Eroded Shell Form was generously donated by the artist and his wife, Kathi Giddings, who also funded its restoration and relocation.

Restoration, preparation, and installation of the Giddings work were coordinated in partnership with the Florida State University Master Craftsman Studio. The studio's team carefully cleaned, restored, and prepared the sculpture for its new permanent home, with installation overseen by production specialists to ensure the integrity and longevity of the piece.

LeMoyne also recently announced the installation of *Storyteller*, a new large-scale sculpture by Mark Dickson located in the Helen Lind Garden. The 9-foot steel sculpture is installed on the existing round concrete pedestal in the garden and represents part of a totemic series Dickson began in 2012.

Fabricated from plate and sheet steel that has been welded, forged, and hand-formed, *Storyteller* is finished in monochrome urethane paint and uses

negative space, shadow, and abstract form to hold a layered visual narrative. In the work, Dickson reflects on Florida's natural environment: the sun as giver of life, a bird rendered as a reverent figure, lush botanicals, and the powerful presence of hurricanes that shape both landscape and human experience.

With expertise in forging, casting, and welding metals, and on the recommendation of artists from the Florida State University Master Craftsman Studio, Dickson's relationship with LeMoyne is long-standing and deeply collaborative.

"Mark has quietly supported LeMoyne behind the scenes for years," said Arielle Raff, LeMoyne Arts' Executive Director. "From restoration work to a featured sculpture, his generosity and craftsmanship have helped shape the experience of our sculpture gardens for visitors and artists alike."

"These installations are an exciting moment for LeMoyne and for our community," said Dan Taylor, LeMoyne Arts' Board President. "We are honored to provide a permanent home for these important works and to continue building an outdoor space where art, nature, and community intersect."

Project Coordinator, Kelly Dozier said, "Working with TD Giddings and Mark Dickson to bring these two remarkable sculptures to the gardens at LeMoyne was a delightful experience as they both exemplify the utmost professionalism in their work and a true love of our community."

Together, the installations represent a meaningful collaboration between LeMoyne Arts, and local artists, reinforcing a shared commitment to preserving and celebrating Tallahassee's creative identity through accessible art.

The dedication ceremony for *Eroded Shell Form* and *Storyteller* will take place August 22, 2026.

Q: What attracted you to our organization, and what are you most excited about in your new role?

My main role entails handling intake into the gallery shop; this includes processing Gallery Shop artist applications, acquiring new art for the shop, sorting inventory, merchandising the space in a visually appealing or exhibit-relevant fashion, and handling shop finances. Conversely, I also handle the phones, so if you've called LeMoyne in the last 3 months, chances are you've spoken with me. On top of that, I coordinate field trips, our intern cohorts every semester, and table for most of our off-campus outreach.

Q: Are there any specific projects or goals you're particularly excited to work on?

Alex: I'm most excited to turn the Gallery Shop into a space that is at the forefront of Tallahassee's mind when they're looking to get a cool and quirky gift for a friend, or a heartfelt and thoughtful present for a loved one. LeMoyne hosts talent of all kinds, and it is my goal to represent that in the shop to make art accessible to our community. Whether you need a jewelry piece for that concert next weekend, a print to fill that empty space in your living room, or a votive for your outdoor citronella candles, LeMoyne Arts Gallery Shop has what you may not even know you're looking for.
